ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS:

At the Show, unlike in a paddock, animal movement is restricted and the animals can't go and find their own shade/water.

As the Show is held in summer, it is recommended that you bring shade and suitable water containers for your animals.

Whangarei A & P Society will conduct this Show in accordance with the Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows, as ratified by the RAS of NZ, which rules will be on display at the Show Office.

However, please note that the Dairy Section has a current exemption that allows all dairy cattle that are ID recorded with LIC or Ambreed, to enter any relevant dairy class. Dairy cattle do not need to be registered with an RAS affiliated Breed Society to compete at the Whangarei A&P Show.

IMPORTANT HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the Terms of the Health & Safety at Work Act 2016 and its subsequent amendments. Whangarei A&P Society will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. All Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards and Officials. Exhibitors and Competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable. Exhibitors and competitors must ensure that they keep walkways and access ways clear and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public. NO SMOKING is permitted in any toilets, showers, marquee, gazebo or tent. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to impose a fine of \$500.00 on any person found smoking in these areas.

First Aid

First aid is available on the upper level. Contact the Show Office. Accidents must be reported to your Chief Steward and the Show Office.

Legal Liability – The Society's policy does not cover Competitors and Exhibitors

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2016. No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

ALL EXHIBITORS are required to maintain good control over their animals and the area in which their animals are stalled and to keep equipment in tidy order at all times so as not to interfere with access through the passageways.

All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner or exhibitor and Whangarei A&P Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss or damage, mis-delivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatsoever.

COMPLETION OF ENTRY FORMS

Entries & Online Entries:

Enter Online at showdayonline.com. Online entries are simple and easy to do - try it- and you save the \$5.00 entry processing fee! Please note online entries are paid at the time of entry. The online entry system allows you to safely pay directly. Note: Youth Section entries are free.

No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied by entry fees. Entries will not be processed unless ALL monies are enclosed and the entry form is properly completed. No telephone entries will be accepted. The onus of responsibility for the accuracy of all entries lies solely with the exhibitor, who must ensure that each entry is legible and that all details required for any class are fully and correctly stated on the entry form.

Several events are run concurrently. Competitors should select which class they favour as there will be no refund of entry fees where classes overlap.

Membership Discount

This only applies if the entrant is a current, financial member of the Whangarei A&P Society as at 30 September of the year of the Show. (WAP Members.)

Refund of Entry Fees

Exhibitors desiring refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. Such application will be considered by the Committee, and if successful, refunds will be made less 25%.

Late Entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. The only exception to the late entry rule will be for Stock Judging classes. Late entries in these sections will only be accepted at the discretion of the ring steward prior to the start of competition.

Receipt of Entries

COMPETITORS are responsible for checking their entry receipt/confirmation carefully. A receipt showing all details of your entries will be returned to you following data processing. Your entry form will NOT be returned to you. Any alterations to classes must be made to the Show Secretary by 30 November in writing (email preferred).

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Electronic or Audio Equipment

Electronic or Audio Equipment carried on a competitor deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor is banned from all competitions at any RAS or affiliated shows, with the penalty of forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that show.

Gate Admission Passes

One gate admission wrist band is provided per competitor as named on the entry form. A coloured wrist band will be issued which must be WORN in order to allow you entry to the Showgrounds. The wrist band is water proof and tear proof and can be left on for the duration of the Show. The wrist band will be mailed to you along with your entry receipt/confirmation, prior to the Show. Additional gate admission can be paid for at the gate.

Catalogue/Substitutions

When an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class, the substitution of another animal will not be permitted.

Ground Levy

Where applicable, a ground levy of \$7.00 per animal, to a maximum of \$20.00, must be included with entry forms.

Class Amalgamation

The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes if there are insufficient entries or split classes if they are too large.

Prize Money

In all classes throughout the schedule, the full prize money will be paid out if there are four or more entries.

- Where the Prize Money is 1st = \$50, 2nd = \$30, 3rd = 20, 4th = 10 (Cattle Classes) if there are three entries or less, prize money will be scaled as follows:
 - 1 entry 1st \$10
 - 2 entries 1st, 2nd \$20, \$15
 - 3 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$25, \$15, \$10
 - 4 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th \$50, \$30, \$20, \$10
- Where the Prize Money is 1st = \$30, 2nd = \$20, 3rd = 10 (e.g. Sheep Classes) if there are three entries or less, prize money will be scaled as follows:
 - 1 entry 1st \$10
 - 2 entries 1st, 2nd \$15, \$10
 - 3 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$15, \$10, \$5
 - 4 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$30, \$20, \$10If applicable, sponsored prize money of a section or class may be paid in lieu of Society prize money and will not be additional. Sponsorships are subject to confirmation.

Prizewinners

Ribbons and prizemoney will be presented on conclusion of events. Whangarei A&P Society no longer allows cups and trophies to leave the Showgrounds. Cups and trophies are available for viewing in the trophy cabinet inside the foyer at the Barge Showgrounds Events Centre.

Publication of Show Results & Photos

The Whangarei Agricultural & Pastoral Society reserves the right to publish show results. Entry in the show entitles the Society to publish an exhibitor's name in result reports and distribute with exhibitor lists. Furthermore, as an entrant in the Show, any photographs taken of entries, competitors or exhibitors may be used for publicity purposes by the Society.

Alteration to Programme and Prize Money

The Whangarei A & P Society reserves the right to alter the programme and prizemoney without prior notice.

Dogs and/or other animals

It is the preference of the Whangarei A&P Society that no animal except those entered in the Catalogue, or as part of a Trade Display or Entertainment, is brought to the Showgrounds during the Show. IF a dog is brought onto the grounds, it must be on a lead at all times OR fully contained and controlled within a vehicle or horse float. In NO circumstances is a dog to be walking or running free on the Showgrounds during the Show. This includes after hours.

FORMALITIES & PROTOCOLS

Rights of Whangarei A&P Society & Committee

The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alteration to the Show timetable, or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable.

All persons admitted into any premise controlled by the Society are subject to the orders of the Society's committee and officials. Should any such person, in the opinion of the Society, its committee or officials, infringe any of these Conditions and Regulations or refuse to comply with the directions of the same, or be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice or any deceit or concealment either in entering or exhibiting or competing, shall be disqualified. Furthermore, their

name shall not appear in the official prize list, and the Society shall have power to suspend such person from exhibiting or competing during such period as it may think fit. The decision of Whangarei A&P Society and its committee shall be absolutely final in all cases.

DISEASE CONTROL

PLEASE READ THE MPI / BIOSECURITY INFORMATION IN THIS SCHEDULE.

Tuberculosis Testing

- 1) **ALL LIVESTOCK: Must Have a TB Animal Status Declaration Card (including calf club animals). A copy of the Declaration must accompany entry forms and the ORIGINAL must be brought with you to the Show as they will be inspected in the unloading area. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved.**
- 2) All cattle entered for showing must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card, showing a TB Clear Status in accordance with present legislation.
- 3) All exhibitors must sign the declaration on the official entry form.
- 4) Animals being moved to a show MUST HAVE the Official NAIT location identity number included on entry forms and the animals MUST HAVE the WHITE, NAIT approved RFID ear tag Identification.
- 5) **NORTHLAND LIVESTOCK:** For animals from Northland [C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas] NO test is required but a clearly dated test allocation form or other documentation from the Animal Health Board must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test.
- 6) **ALL AREAS OTHER THAN NORTHLAND:** For animals from all other herds and areas –
 - If the herd has a C3 status or better, no test is required PROVIDED the last whole herd test was within 12 months prior to the show.
 - If the last whole herd test was not within 12 months of the show, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - If the herd has a status of C1 or C2, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - This certificate showing individual animal identification numbers and current status MUST accompany completed entry forms or the entry will not be able to be accepted by the Secretary.

Yellow Card - This Show/Event supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system

A Yellow Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view at www.ras.org.nz.

Clean Sport Testing

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden RAS Rule Changes 2015 Page 5. A Forbidden Substance is any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

Arrears

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

Summary of RAS Resolution Process:

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

Protests

As per the RAS Complaints Procedure adopted in June 2013, all protests must be in writing and detail the specific RAS or Whangarei A&P Society rule that has been breached. The protest must be lodged with the Show Secretary, preferably at the time of the incident, or within 10 days of the incident. Any protest lodged outside of this time frame will not be considered. A \$50.00 deposit must accompany the protest. (The RAS Complaints Procedure can be found on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz - under Rules and Regulations.)

Sportsmanship

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors with the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition, therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges, show officials or animals may be asked at the discretion of the Show, to leave the Showground.

Discipline

The CEO, President, or any two members of the Whangarei A&P Society Executive Committee may eject from the Showgrounds, without compensation or return of fees, any person whose conduct or behaviour, either personal or as proprietor of a side show or exhibit, is a source of annoyance. This includes any exhibitor, competitor or member of the public who behaves in a manner, which in the opinion of the Judges or Society representatives, is considered to be rude, bad manners, disobedient or abusive or which is designed to be or has the effect of harassing or being discourteous to any Steward, Judge, or other Show Official, animal or exhibit.

Penalty

Penalty for such offence may include expulsion from the Show, disqualification, suspension from exhibiting during such period as it may think fit.

Beef Breeds Open Ring

Saturday 7th December - starting 10.00am

Please also see the conditions of entry in the front of this schedule and below.

Please also ensure that you have read the MPI / Biosecurity information in this schedule.

Open Calf Classes are only open to exhibitors who have entered Cows into the In milk Dairy Section. Any calves entered must have been born, reared and still reside on the exhibitors property at the time of the Show.

All animals must have eartags which will be wanded on arrival at the Show. Show arrival times will be set and staggered to allow exhibitors to use the wash down facilities with no other cattle present. This will also allow for proper disinfecting between exhibitors. Once entries have closed exhibitors will be advised of their show arrival time.

CONDITIONS:

- 1) All cattle must be registered with their respective breed societies and that breed must be affiliated to the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ.
- 2) If a female has a calf at foot, it may accompany her in the ring.
- 3) All registered cattle must have station number visible and listed on entry form.
- 4) All cattle must tie up and be led for judging. **Cattle may only be tied up with animals from the same property.**
- 5) All beef bulls in other than yearling classes must be rung and led by the ring and be under adequate supervision.
- 6) All bulls must be securely tied in the stall by an adequate chain as well as a stout leather halter with an adequate rope attached.
- 7) All beef cows 3 years and over must be shown with a calf at foot born on or after 1st June in the current show season.
- 8) No cattle to leave the Showgrounds before 3 p.m.
- 9) All cattle must be entered in the name of the bona-fide owner.
- 10) Age of cattle in this section shall be computed as at 1st June.
- 11) As the age of all cattle is determined from 1st June each year, all animals will be deemed to be one year older at this date.
- 12) Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.
- 13) Exhibitors leading or parading stock in judging rings must wear clean white attire (shirts) or breed uniform, and these may not carry any distinguishing words or emblems.
- 14) Highland Cattle:
 - A copy of a valid RAS Highland passport must accompany all Highland Cattle entries.
 - Entries received without a RAS passport will not be accepted or processed.
 - Any queries on the RAS Highland Passport to be directed to the RAS, P O Box 54, Woodend Ph (03) 313 1004.

Trophies:

Due to the Beef Rings being combined, any breed trophies will be awarded to the highest point scorer for the respective breed in each particular class.

A History of the Meat & Wool Cup:
Phillip Hereford, the editor of the main agricultural magazine of the time, conceived the concept of having a trophy to award to the Supreme Beef Exhibit of the All Breeds Sections at Shows throughout New Zealand. This Award was named after the magazine that were the initial sponsors - the Meat & Wool Magazine. Hence the Meat & Wool Cup, which has kept its name and is a highly sought after Award.

Class 562 **Meat & Wool Cup**

Notes:

Only the Junior & Senior Champions qualify to compete in the Meat & Wool Cup.

Judging of the Meat & Wool Cup

1. The Meat & Wool Cup will be awarded to the entry winning the highest number of points.
2. If there is more than one judge, each judge will be issued with a card on which they will enter their 1st to 4th placings.
3. At the conclusion of the judging, these cards will be handed to the senior steward who will calculate points as follows:
1st 6 points
2nd 4 points
3rd 2 points
4th 1 point
4. The animal then gaining the most points will be the winner.
5. Should there be a tie, the animal with the most firsts shall win.
6. In the event of there still being a tie, the most seconds, then thirds, then fourth placings will be taken into account.
7. If there is still a tie, a panel of judges will be called to determine between the tied entries.

NO LATE ENTRIES or substitutes will be accepted on Show day, except in the Stock Judging Section.

RULES FOR DAIRY CATTLE:

Please see the conditions of Entry at the front of this Schedule and as follows.

Please also ensure that you have read the MPI / Biosecurity information in this schedule. Open Calf Classes are only open to exhibitors who have entered Cows into the In milk Dairy Section. Any calves entered must have been born, reared and still reside on the exhibitors property at the time of the Show.

All animals must have eartags which will be wanded on arrival at the Show. Show arrival times will be set and staggered to allow exhibitors to use the wash down facilities with no other cattle present. This will also allow for proper disinfecting between exhibitors. Once entries have closed exhibitors will be advised of their show arrival time.

1. Dairy classes are open to all breeds, pedigree or unregistered animals that are ID recorded (with LIC or Ambreed).
2. All animals to have a Condition Score of not less than 4.5 to be allowed entry into the ring.
3. All cattle must tie up and be led for judging. **Cattle may only be tied up with animals from the same property.**
4. Exhibitors leading or parading stock in judging rings must wear clean, white attire (shirt) or a breed uniform and these may not carry any distinguishing words or emblems.
5. No animal will be allowed to compete in more than one class, except in Special Classes, and in Special Classes no animal may compete without being entered in ordinary class for which it is eligible.
6. All cattle entries in-milk classes must be accompanied by production figures for the last period, on entry form.
7. All cattle (except unregistered calves) must be named on entry form - no exceptions.
8. If any injection or dosing is given to any animal the exhibitor must report this to a Chief Steward of the section.
9. Any alteration of conformation of cattle as per RAS rules will be considered malpractice and disqualified from the show.
10. All led cattle must carry number corresponding with entry number.
11. These numbers will be issued on morning of Show.
12. It will be an instruction to the judge that no awards be made unless exhibit is true to type.

13. All dairy cattle must be haltered and housed in the cattle pavilion.
14. All cattle must be entered in the name of the bona-fide owner.
15. Age of cattle in this section shall be computed as at 1st June. All animals will be deemed to be one year older at this date.
16. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

Trophies:

Due to the Dairy Rings being combined, any breed trophies will be awarded to the highest point scorer for the respective breed in each particular class.

Supreme Champion Cow of All Dairy Breeds - Alfa Laval Perpetual Challenge Cup:

Judging for the Supreme Champion Cow of all Dairy Breeds will commence immediately following the in-milk classes.

- Champions are eligible for this competition.
- To be judged at a time set by the Stewards.

Dairy Cattle Rules (reminder of Rules as of 2015)

The exhibiting of all Dairy Cattle in New Zealand is governed by the RAS Dairy Cattle Show Code of Ethics document. This document is an Appendix to the RAS Additional Rules for Showing – Specific Sections. Other Dairy Cattle show conditions outside of the RAS Dairy Cattle Show Code of Ethics are listed below:

- a) All groups and cows in milk in the Dairy Breeds to be judged first.
- b) All Dairy Bulls two years and over must be rung, have two leaders and under adequate supervision.
- c) All Dairy Yearling Bulls must be rung and be under adequate supervision
- d) Production Classes: Entries are only valid if correct production records are provided with entry. Copies of production figures are available for viewing by request to the chief steward.
- e) No records are necessary for maiden three-year-olds.
- f) Points in the dairy section, for most points awards and championships will be as follows:

	In Milk	Dry Classes
1st	10	6
2nd	8	4
3rd	6	2
4th	4	1

Championship 2 points and reserve Champion 1 point in both classes.
- g) \$5.75 including GST levy is to be charged per in-milk cow per show i.e. if an in-milk cow is entered in more than one class at a show then the levy is still \$5.75.
There is no levy on exhibiting young stock.
