Livestock Rules, Regulations & Conditions of Entry

DISEASE CONTROL- PLEASE READ THE MPI / BIOSECURITY INFORMATION IN THIS SCHEDULE.

Tuberculosis Testing

1. ALL LIVESTOCK: Must have a TB Animal Status Declaration Card (including calf club animals). A copy of the Declaration must accompany entry forms and the ORIGINAL must be brought with you to the Show as they will be inspected in the unloading area. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved.
2. All cattle entered for showing must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card, showing a TB Clear Status in accordance with present legislation.
3. All exhibitors must sign the declaration on the official entry form.
4. Animals being moved to a show MUST HAVE the Official NAIT location identity number included on entry forms and the animals MUST HAVE the WHITE, NAIT approved RFID ear tag Identification.
5. NORTHLAND LIVESTOCK: For animals from Northland [C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas] NO test is required but a clearly dated test allocation form or other documentation from OSPRI must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test.
6. ALL AREAS OTHER THAN NORTHLAND: For animals from all other herds and areas -
 - a. If the herd has a C3 status or better, no test is required PROVIDED the last whole herd test was within 12 months prior to the show.
 - b. If the last whole herd test was not within 12 months of the show, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - c. If the herd has a status of C1 or C2, then show cattle over one year old MUST have a clear test within 60 DAYS of the show.
 - d. This certificate showing individual animal identification numbers and current status MUST accompany completed entry forms or the entry will not be able to be accepted by the Secretary.
7. Force Majeure- The Society will not be liable for any delay or failure to fulfil its obligations resulting from a Force Majeure Event. The exhibitor acknowledges that any reimbursement of any fees paid where a Force Majeure Event disrupts the Show is at the Society's discretion. The Society will determine whether or not to refund in whole or in part, any payment made by the Exhibitor – or waive any payment the Exhibitor is liable to make under these terms. (Force Majeure means any event/occurrence beyond our reasonable control including but not limited to acts of God, public enemy, flood, earthquake, storm or the like and which could not have reasonably foreseen or taken reasonable measures to prevent.)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS

Whangarei A & P Society will conduct this Show in accordance with the Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows, as ratified by the RAS of NZ, which rules will be on display at the Show Office.

Please note we allow all dairy cattle that are ID recorded with LIC or Ambreed, to enter any relevant dairy class.

HEALTH & SAFETY

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the Terms of the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 and its subsequent amendments. Whangarei A&P Society will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. All Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards and Officials. Exhibitors and Competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable. Exhibitors and competitors must ensure that they keep walkways and access ways clear and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public. NO SMOKING is permitted in any toilets, showers, marquee, gazebo or tent. Whangarei A&P Society reserves the right to impose a fine of \$500.00 on any person found smoking in these areas.

First Aid

First aid is available on the upper level. Contact the Show Office. Accidents must be reported to your Chief Steward and the Show Office.

Legal Liability – The Society's policy does not cover Competitors and Exhibitors

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head steward of that ring.

Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

ALL EXHIBITORS are required to maintain good control over their animals and the area in which their animals are stalled and to keep equipment in tidy order at all times so as not to interfere with access through the passageways.

All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner or exhibitor and Whangarei A&P Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss or damage, mis-delivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatsoever.

COMPLETION OF ENTRY FORMS

Online Entries

Enter online at showdayonline.com. Online entries are simple and easy to do. We accept online or email entries only. Please note that online entries are paid at the time of entry. The online entry system allows you to safely pay directly. Note: Youth Section entries are free.

No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied by entry fees. Entries will not be processed unless ALL monies are enclosed and the entry form is properly completed. No telephone entries will be accepted. The onus of responsibility for the accuracy of all entries lies solely with the exhibitor, who must ensure that each entry is legible and that all details required for any class are fully and correctly stated on the entry form. Several events are run concurrently. Competitors should select which class they favour as there will be no refund of entry fees where classes overlap.

Membership Discount

This only applies if the entrant is a current, financial member of the Whangarei A&P Society as at 30 September of the year of the Show. (WAP Members.)

Refund of Entry Fees

Exhibitors desiring refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. Such application will be considered by the Committee, and if successful, refunds will be made less 25%.

Late Entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Entries Close 5pm on Monday 23rd November.

Receipt of Entries

COMPETITORS are responsible for checking their entry receipt/confirmation carefully. A receipt showing all details of your entries will be returned to you following data processing. Please note any overpaid entry fees will only be refunded upon request and if the overpayment is \$5.00 or more. Entry forms will NOT be returned to you. Any alterations to classes must be made to the Show Secretary by 25th November in writing (by email). NO EXCEPTIONS other than Novice upgrading changes.

Arrears

Any person who is in arrears regarding entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is ineligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

SHOW CANCELLATION

If the Show is unable to proceed due to restrictions out of our control- entry fees will be refunded less an administration fee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Electronic or Audio Equipment

Electronic or Audio Equipment carried on a competitor deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor is banned from all competitions at any RAS or affiliated shows, with the penalty of forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that show.

Gate Admission Passes

One gate admission is provided per competitor as named on the entry form.

Catalogue/Substitutions

When an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class, the substitution of another animal will not be permitted.

Class Amalgamation

The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes if there are insufficient entries or split classes if they are too large.

Prize Money

In all classes throughout the schedule, the full prize money will be paid out if there are four or more entries. If there are three entries or less, prize money will be scaled.

For example, where the Prize Money is 1st = \$30, 2nd = \$20, 3rd = \$10:

- 1 entry 1st \$10
- 2 entries 1st, 2nd \$10, \$10
- 3 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$10, \$10, \$10
- 4 entries 1st, 2nd, 3rd \$30, \$20, \$10

Sponsored prize money of a section or class may be paid in lieu of Society prize money and will not be additional. Sponsorships are subject to confirmation.

Prize winners

Ribbons and prizemoney will be presented on conclusion of events. Whangarei A&P Society no longer allows cups and trophies to leave the Showgrounds. Cups and trophies are available for viewing in the trophy cabinet inside the foyer at the Barge Showgrounds Events Centre

Publication of Show Results & Photos

Whangarei Agricultural & Pastoral Society reserves the right to publish show results. Entry in the show entitles the Society to publish an exhibitor's name in result reports and distribute with exhibitor lists. Furthermore, as an entrant in the Show, any photographs taken of entries, competitors or exhibitors may be used for publicity purposes by the Society.

Alteration to Programme and Prize Money

The Whangarei A & P Society reserves the right to alter the programme and prizemoney without prior notice.

Dogs and/or other animals

It is the preference of the Whangarei A&P Society that no animal except those entered in the Catalogue, or as part of a Trade Display or Entertainment, is brought to the Showgrounds during the Show. IF a dog is brought onto the grounds, it must be on a lead at all times OR fully contained and controlled within a vehicle or horse float. In NO circumstances is a dog to be walking or running free on the Showgrounds during the Show. This includes after hours.

FORMALITIES & PROTOCOLS

Rights of Whangarei A&P Society & Committee

The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alteration to the Show timetable, or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable.

All persons admitted into any premise controlled by the Society are subject to the orders of the Society's committee and officials. Should any such person, in the opinion of the Society, its committee or officials, infringe any of these Conditions and Regulations or refuse to comply with the directions of the same, or be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice or any deceit or concealment either in entering or exhibiting or competing, shall be disqualified. Furthermore, their name shall not appear in the official prize list, and the Society shall have power to suspend such person from exhibiting or competing during such period as it may think fit. The decision of Whangarei A&P Society and its committee shall be absolutely final in all cases.

Sportsmanship

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors with the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition. Therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges, show officials or animals may be asked at the discretion of the Show, to leave the Showground.

Discipline

Bad behaviour will not be tolerated. The CEO, President, or any two members of the Whangarei A&P Society Executive Committee may eject from the Showground, without compensation or return of fees, any person whose conduct or behaviour, either personal or as proprietor of a side show or exhibit, is a source of annoyance. This includes any exhibitor, competitor or member of the public who behaves in a manner, which in the opinion of the Judges or Society representatives, is considered to be rude, bad manners, disobedient or abusive or which is designed to be or has the effect of harassing or being discourteous to any Steward, Judge, or other Show Official, animal or exhibit.

Penalty

Penalty for such offence may include expulsion from the Show, disqualification, suspension from exhibiting during such period as it may think fit.

Issues, Disputes, Protests, Yellow and Red Cards

The principle behind this process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand; in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, then it is forwarded on to the RAS CEO to handle in an appropriate manner. The full process can be found at:

RULES FOR DAIRY CATTLE:

Please see the conditions of Entry at the front of this Schedule and as follows.

Please also ensure that you have read the MPI / Biosecurity information in this schedule.

Open Dairy Classes are only open to exhibitors who have not entered Calf Club (Except Young Handler). Any calves entered must have been reared and still reside on the exhibitors property at the time of the Show.

All animals must have ear tags which may be scanned on arrival at the Show. Show arrival times will be set and staggered to allow exhibitors to use the wash down facilities with no other cattle present. This will also allow for proper disinfecting between exhibitors. Once entries have closed exhibitors will be advised of their show arrival time.

1. Dairy classes are open to all breeds, pedigree or unregistered animals that are ID recorded (with LIC or CRV).
2. All animals need a Body Condition Score of not less than 4.5 to be allowed entry in the ring.
3. All cattle must tie up and be led for judging. Cattle may only be tied up with animals from the same property.
4. Exhibitors leading or parading stock in judging rings must wear clean, white attire (shirt) or a breed uniform and these may not carry any distinguishing words or emblems.
5. No animal will be allowed to compete in more than one class, except in Special Classes, and in Special Classes no animal may compete without being entered in ordinary class for which it is eligible.
6. All cattle entries in-milk classes must be accompanied by production figures for the last period, on entry form.
7. All cattle (except unregistered calves) must be named on entry form - no exceptions.
8. If any injection or dosing is given to any animal the exhibitor must report this to a Chief Steward of the section.
9. Any alteration of conformation of cattle as per RAS rules will be considered malpractice and disqualified from the show.
10. All led cattle must carry number corresponding with entry number.
11. These numbers will be issued on morning of Show.
12. It will be an instruction to the judge that no awards be made unless exhibit is true to type.
13. All dairy cattle must be haltered and housed in the designated cattle tie up area.
14. All cattle must be entered in the name of the bona-fide owner.
15. Age of cattle in this section shall be computed as at 1st June. All animals will be deemed to be one year older at this date.
16. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

RAS Dairy Cattle Code of Ethics rules apply to this Show.

Prize Money:

Open Calf Classes are only open to exhibitors who have not entered Calf Club (Except Young Handler).
Open Calf Classes are only open to calves reared and still residing on the exhibitors property at the time of the Show.

All animals must have ear tags. Show arrival times will be set and staggered to allow exhibitors to use the wash down facilities with no other cattle present. This will also allow for proper disinfecting between exhibitors. Once entries have closed exhibitors will be advised of their show arrival time.

CONDITIONS:

1. All cattle must be registered with their respective breed societies and that breed must be affiliated with the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ. (Except Special classes)
2. All animals need a Body Condition Score of not less than 4 to be allowed entry in the ring.
3. If a female has a calf at foot, it may accompany her in the ring.
4. All registered cattle must have station number visible and listed on entry form.
5. All cattle must tie up and be led for judging. Cattle may only be tied up with animals from the same property.
6. All beef bulls in other than yearling classes must be rung and led by the ring and be under adequate supervision.
7. All bulls must be securely tied in the stall by an adequate chain as well as a stout leather halter with an adequate rope attached.
8. All beef cows 3 years and over must be shown with a calf at foot born on or after 1st June in the current show season.
9. No cattle to leave the Showgrounds before 3pm.
10. All cattle must be entered in the name of the bona-fide owner.
11. Age of cattle in this section shall be computed as at 1st June.
12. As the age of all cattle is determined from 1st June each year, all animals will be deemed to be one year older at this date.
13. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.
14. Exhibitors leading or parading stock in judging rings must wear clean white attire (shirts) or breed uniform, and these may not carry any distinguishing words or emblems

Trophies:

Due to the Beef Rings being combined, any breed trophies will be awarded to the highest point scorer for the respective breed in each particular class.

Prize Money:

In all classes throughout the schedule, the full prize money will be paid out if there are four or more entries. If there are three entries or less, prize money will be scaled.

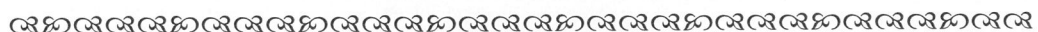
Judging of the Meat & Wool Cup

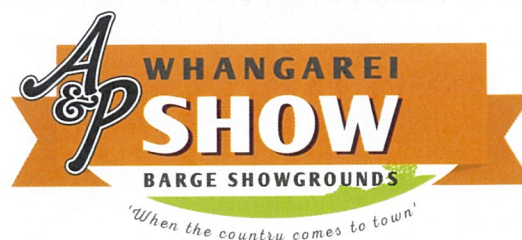

2. If any query arises during the day, it will be referred by the Steward to the Judge. The Judge's decision will be final.
3. Competitors must care for and feed the animals themselves as soon as possible after birth.
4. Only one animal may be entered by each competitor.
5. If the owner is indisposed a substitute handler may show the animal, but if a ribbon is won, it is to go to the owner.
6. When selecting the Champion and Reserve, the 1st placegetter or any competitor with two 2nd places in leading and rearing will be eligible.
7. The course for leading will be a figure 8 shape.
8. The animal will be on the right hand side of the competitor.

Calves - Conditions of Entry

1. Competitions are open to heifer, steer or bull calves, of any breed.
2. Calves must be born between 1st July and 30th September.
3. There shall be adopted a uniform system for calf judging and all Judges will conform to standards as set down by the Chief Steward.
4. Calf leads to be approximately 1½ metres long.
5. For the purpose of judging type, calves are divided into three groups:
 - a. Light breeds (Jersey & Ayrshire)
 - b. Heavy breeds (Shorthorn & Holstein Friesian)
 - c. Beef breeds

Lambs/Goats - Conditions of Entry

1. Lambs & Goats must be born after 1st July.
2. Lambs may be brushed.
3. SPOT washing of lambs/goats may be permitted but not to the extent that the natural oil is washed from the fleece.

1. This section is designed to bridge the gap between Calf Club and the Open Ring. Classes are judged on leading, presentation, courtesy, dress, showmanship and relationship between exhibitor and animal
2. Points will be awarded out of 10 for each class entered
3. Only one entry per exhibitor
4. Exhibitor does not have to own the animal
5. Animals entered in this class may be shown and presented as they come, direct from the paddock, or groomed and clipped - the choice is yours. The judge's focus is the exhibitor and their relationship with the animal, rather than the animal/conformation.
6. Three age groups will apply from 12 to 25 years, but they will all compete together in the ring (unless numbers dictate otherwise, in which case the steward will separate exhibitors into smaller groups). (Age groups subject to stewards discretion on the day but likely 12-15, 16-18, 19-25)
7. If numbers warrant, 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings will be awarded in each age bracket.
